In accordance with the conditions applied at Erasmus University Rotterdam as indicated in the Collective Labour Agreement of the Dutch universities, the salary is in the range € 2,693 to € 3,636 (Scale 7) for full-time employment. Preference is given to a candidate who, if the work requires it, is flexible in terms of working hours and days. The position requires physical presence mostly at the office, but it is also possible to work partly from home.
