FOREWORD BY THE RECTOR OF ISS

Prof. Ruard Ganzevoort

**Nothing is as practical as profound
knowledge**

PhD graduation ceremonies are among my favourite events in academia. These are the rites of passage in the scholarly world. They are proof that the graduates are qualified to do independent academic research. Their title is the license to speak with authority and for many the pathway to taking up leadership positions in universities, government and society. No wonder these moments are precious to the graduates with their friends and family.

But these ceremonies are also very important to the International Institute of Social Studies. The whole purpose of the Institute since its beginnings has been to contribute to global development and social justice through capacity strengthening. As a knowledge partner for just transitions, the ultimate level of this capacity strengthening is the PhD degree that we have awarded since the 1970s, including now 300 on PhD-level.

PhD candidates joined ISS for a combination of three strong motivations. Of course there must be academic aspirations, because the investment in time, focus, and often money is substantial. The ambition to build a further career on that investment is an important driver to continue, even when the process can be challenging. Although this is true for every PhD trajectory at every university, many of our PhD researchers come from underprivileged backgrounds and have to sacrifice even more to reach the endpoint.

The second motivation to join ISS is the dedication to critical scholarship. It is the willingness to challenge and critique taken for granted perspectives that dominate our economic, political and social worlds. We do not settle for common understandings of economic growth, wealth, justice, sustainability, innovation, health and so on, because these common understandings are fundamentally determined by histories of power, oppression and exploitation. A true search for knowledge therefore needs to look critically at the concepts that form the core of our understanding of the world.

And that links to the third motivation. PhD researchers at ISS have a deep desire to change the world. Sometimes with radical proposals for a systems change. Sometimes with pragmatic steps to optimize societal processes. But always building bridges between fundamental theory and concrete practices.

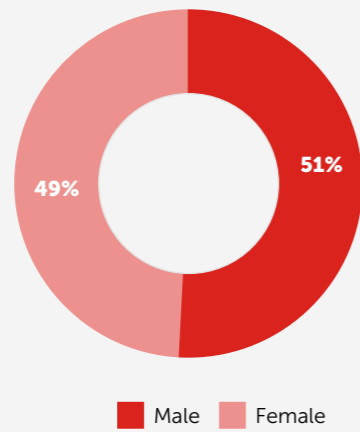


More and more this has also shaped the interdisciplinary nature of research at ISS. Global challenges require the combination of multiple perspectives - climate change, digital revolutions, geopolitics, economic inequalities ... There are always ecological, economic, political, technological AND social dimensions involved, and the latter is the unique strength of ISS.

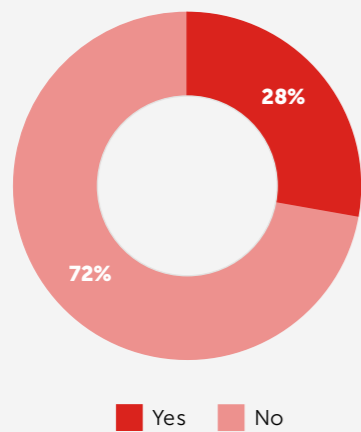
This critical interdisciplinary approach in making impact is perhaps the common denominator of our PhD graduates. They change the world because nothing is as practical as profound knowledge.

Statistics 300 PhD alumni

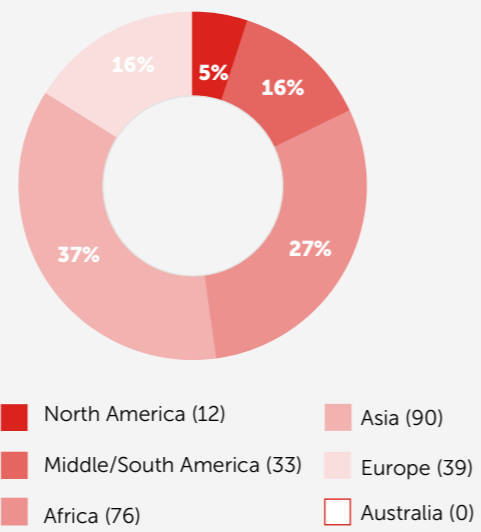
Gender distribution of PhD graduates



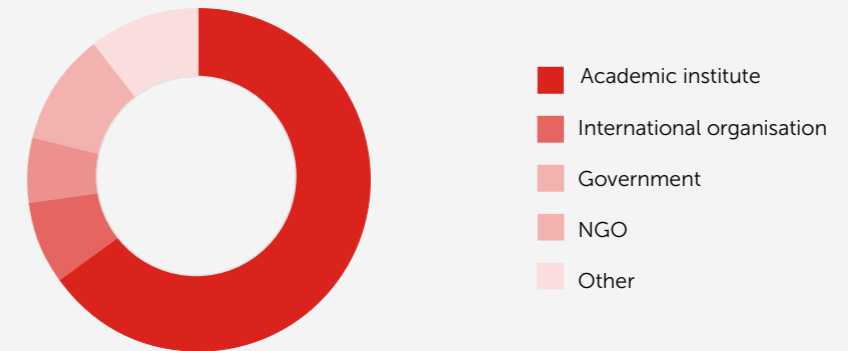
Previous study at ISS



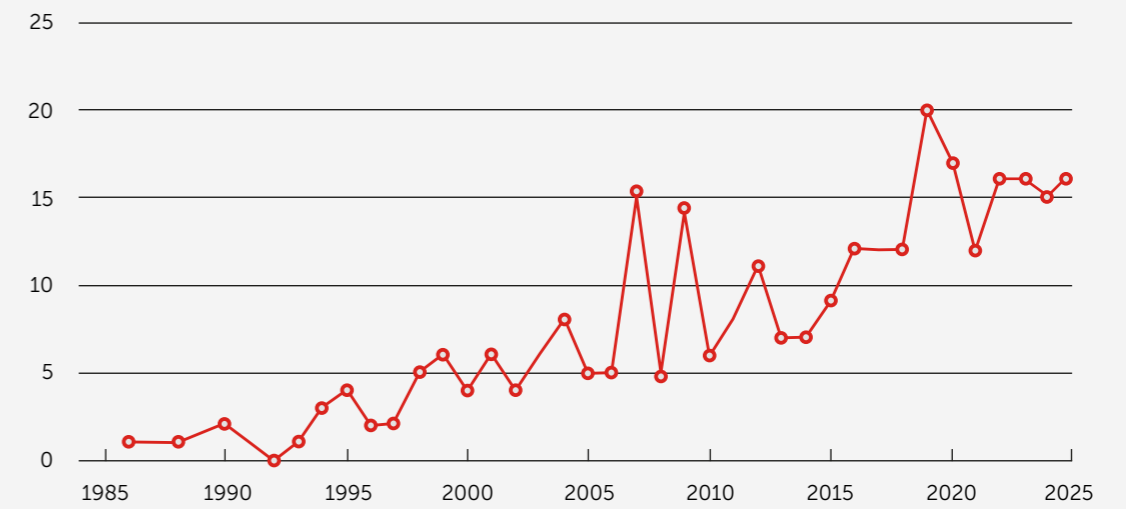
Region of origin of PhD graduates

REFLECTION WITH

Three hundred enthusiastic, committed, and proud intellectuals have walked out of Aula B of the International Institute of Social Studies with a doctoral degree in hand.

Three hundred times, this event has marked the transition to a new stage in a scholarly career. They heard it many times when their doctoral defences concluded, but I must say it once again: Congratulations to all 300 of them! Hora est – it is time.

The PhD was only the beginning. In hindsight, hora erat (it was time) for the 300 emerging scholars who went on to join academia, think tanks, governments and international organizations. For me, it was academia; I am number 83 in this brochure, and I have never left ISS. When I received my degree from Bert Helmsing, Irene van Staveren and Erhard Berner, I thought it was the highest intellectual achievement I could ever hope for. Almost two decades later, serving as Deputy Rector for Research Affairs and sporting the gray hairs of experience myself, I can bear witness to what my supervisors told me back then: it is a milestone that will change your life, but you can expect even more from the long road ahead.

The PhD programme owes much to the vision and energy of Louis Emmerij, rector between 1976 and 1985. He was convinced that an institute like ISS needed a doctoral programme to increase its impact. Under his administration, the first doctoral candidate, Kappadath Kannan, was admitted to the programme in 1982, even before a PhD trajectory was authorized (Wolfson, 2004). Official approval came in 1986, and Dr Kannan received his degree. Emmerij was no longer at ISS to see it happen, having been appointed President of the OECD Development Centre in Paris.

ISS became the only non-university institute under Dutch Higher Education Law with the right to award PhD degrees. How did this happen? For this contribution, I interviewed two retired professors who witnessed the origins of the programme. Ben White recalls that Emmerij strategically announced that a doctoral committee had been formed and that the thesis had been accepted for publication by Oxford University Press before it was defended, arguing that the programme therefore needed formal approval. James Bjorkman adds that the right political climate and connections were essential to securing that approval. Both explanations remind us how ISS pushed the limits of what the system could do, and how much we need to protect our special rights. The right to have a PhD programme was well earned.



In April 2016, ISS celebrated its 150th PhD defence. Remarkably, it has taken ISS barely a decade to complete the same number of defences as it did in its first three decades. There are several reasons for this acceleration. PhD degrees have become much more common in higher education worldwide and ISS has more staff with supervision capacities.

The programme has become more structured and clearly attractive to young scholars. At the same time, it has become flexible enough to accommodate both residential and non-residential candidates, under single- and double-degree agreements and through both funded and self-funded trajectories. Professor Irene van Staveren contributed a piece similar to this one in 2016, in which she speculated that the ISS PhD programme would remain strong – both in its training dimension and in its contribution to scientific and societal relevance through a great variety of PhD theses and resulting publications.

The 300 have lived up to the promise and aim higher.
